





Did You Know? From Buildings & Grounds: Jane Ives gets in "Good Trouble"

Did you know that the spirit of "good trouble" was alive and well at FCPC in the late 1800s? According to Melvin B. Stedman Jr. in his book *Falls Church by Fence and Fireside*, J.D. Brash, a former Confederate soldier, owned a saloon on Broad Street, opposite where Brown's Hardware is today. Mrs. Jane (Auchmoody) Ives, a member of FCPC, and a group of her lady friends considered this enterprise to be an embarrassment to the community and met at the entrance every afternoon and evening singing "hymns of praise and supplication," reading scripture, and saying prayers. Whether it was the singing or the prayers that drove the customers away we may never know, but after about a month the saloon closed for good.

CREATION AND PROVIDENCE



The opening line of this hymn was inspired by the three divine attributes listed in 1 Timothy 1:17 (King James Version), and it continues by considering how God's life exceeds our own finite existence. The text is well set to a Welsh melody shaped by many three-note units.
