


#### Maundy Thursday

#### **Good Friday**



## Filled with the Gift – Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Ordinary Time

Pentecost marks the continuation of the Christian church begun in Jesus. We remember the Holy Spirit descending on the disciples' heads and equipping them to spread the good news of the gospel to the ends of the earth. The color of Pentecost is red.

## **ELEVENTH READING**

Trinity Sunday is observed the Sunday after Pentecost. It focuses on the doctrine of the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, three persons in one godhead. Its color is white.

## **TWELFTH READING**

Ordinary Time is the time between Trinity Sunday and Christ the King/Reign of Christ, which marks the end of the liturgical year. It is called Ordinary Time because the weeks are counted with ordinal numbers following Pentecost. The color for Ordinary Time is green.


